## Welcome to Lifesavers 10

During the decade of the 1980s, the nation made great progress in highway safety. Since the first Lifesavers conference in 1982, states have worked diligently to prevent drinking and driving and encourage child safety seat and safety belt use laws. Lifesavers conferences played an important role as a forum for participants to gain technical expertise and share ideas.

As a result many states have tough DUI laws, safety belt laws and all 50 states have child safety seat laws. According to the Fatal Accident Reporting System (FARS), nationally, traffic fatalities dropped nearly 13 percent from 1980 to 1990 and the fatality rate decreased from 22.48 to 17.90 during the same period. While the gains are substantial, it may be we have accomplished the easy part. The challenges in the 1990s include reaching the repeat DUI offender and other high risk populations who disregard traffic laws and do not buckle up.

The new Intermodal Surface Transportation Efficiency Act gives greater emphasis to safety than ever before. As a demonstration of Congressional and Administration concern, the bill includes incentives for states adopting safety belt and helmet use laws and penalties for those that do not.

As the national program moves toward a more efficient transportation system, states must focus on maintenance, traffic management and safety. Research into new technologies, such as Intelligent Vehicle Highway Systems (IVHS), and development of effective public policy will prove critical to future successes.

The Lifesavers Conferences will continue to play an important role in traffic safety. It will take renewed enthusiasm, commitment and cooperation by all concerned to reduce the human and economic pain associated with injuries and fatalities from traffic crashes.

I am certain the information presented at Lifesavers 10 will assist you in developing programs to meet the challenges we face.
