- Requires a Full-time Coordinator
- Each project must focus on 2 of 3 effective strategies:
 - Increasing Restraint Use
 - Increasing Child Safety Seat Use
 - Reducing DUIs

Tribal Motor Vehicle Injury Prevention Program Objectives

- Increase seatbelt use by 5% per year
- Reduce motor vehicle crash (MVCs) injuries and fatalities resulting from alcohol/drug impaired or distracted driving by 2.5%
- Strengthen existing Tribal seatbelt use law
- Strengthen existing Tribal Driving Under the Influence law

TMVIPP Supported Activities

- Conduct DUI & Seat Belt Checkpoints
- Presentations to Schools, Community, and Council
- Educational Booths
- Media for Public Service Announcements
- Proposing stricter Laws & Penalties
- Sacred Cargo Coalition Meetings

Proposed changes in the DWI Code

Present Code

- .10 BAC or higher
- All offenses-\$250 to \$500 up to 6 months in jail and/or up to 2 years • Diversion program, DWI suspended driving privileges

Proposed Code

- .o8 BAC or higher
- \$500 & 6 months in jail to \$5000 fine & 3 years in jail
- classes; 6 months probation

Traffic Code Revision

Old Seat Belt Ordinance

- \$25.00 fine & \$25.00 Court Cost for seat belt violation
- \$25.00 fine & \$25.00 Court Cost for Child Safety Seat

Revised and Passed


- Primary Seat Belt/Child Restraint Law
- \$35.00 plus \$25.00 Court Cost for Seat Belt Violation
- \$250.00 plus \$25.00 Court Cost for Child Safety Seat Violation


TMVIPP Data Collection


- Data collection supports all three projects
- TMVIPP has the lead to collect and summarize 9 CDC-required variables


