
Party Intervention Patrol Pierce County, WA





Prior to 2004-2007 in Pierce County

- √ 16 people had died in crashes involving a teen
 15-20
- ✓ teens were over-involved in fatal crashes (21.5% of the county's total ID fatalities/serious injuries)
- √ three high profile teen fatal crashes occurred

Underage Drinking Party Data

- 3,631 of 12,970 party/loud noise calls to dispatch were identified by callers as potential underage drinking/drug parties
- Coding on party calls was changed to distinquish potential underage from adult parties

The PIP Model

- 1. Law enforcement teams who locate parties/arrest youth and adults
- 2. Courts who prosecute them
- **3. Chemical dependency professionals** who provide a brief interventions and referrals
- **4. Trained parent volunteers** who provide information and resources to youth's parent(s)
- 5. Significant media before and after each PIP

Law Enforcement

- Multi-agency
- Multijurisdictional
- Highly visible
- Sustainable
- Utilizes significant advance intel
- Focused on prosecution, interventions and parent education NOT arrests

Brief Interventions With Youth by Chemical Dependency Professionals

- SBIRT Screening, Brief Intervention & Referral to Treatment
- Proven to decrease injury risk and negative life consequences
- Moved from more typical medical triage setting to community prevention setting

Parent to Parent Meetings


- Trained volunteer parents meet with parents of arrested kids
- Volunteer talking points
 - 1. parents have power over their kid's choices
 - 2. rules and expectations about NO use works
 - 3. monitoring who, what, where, when helps keep kids safe

Media

- Mainstream media loves the story
- Will report on it regularly and in depth if someone they trust "feeds" them the stories
- But youth, themselves, tell the story best!

2007-2014 PIP Profile

- 6-15 PIPs a year for 7 years
- 3-52 arrests per party
- 98 % of youth voluntarily participated in a brief intervention
- 100 % underage kids picked up by parent, guardian or older sibling
- Police call parents of 18, 19, and 20 year-olds when they live at home

1.Change Youth & Adult Behavior



2. Reduce Road Injuries & Deaths


