Travel and expenses fully funded for participants.







Three Workshops Across the U.S.

- In the wake of McNeely vs. Missouri
 - Oregon example
 - Some impact on States with death/serious bodily injury provisions
- · Recent legalization of recreational marijuana
 - Rapid and legal methods to obtain evidence are more important than ever



Results

- Participation was limited to around 85 attendees and presenters
- Overwhelming positive response and demand
- The final workshop in Baltimore was expanded to 120 participants and presenters
