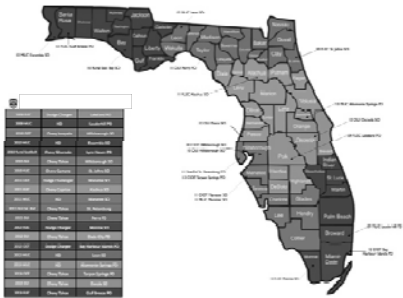

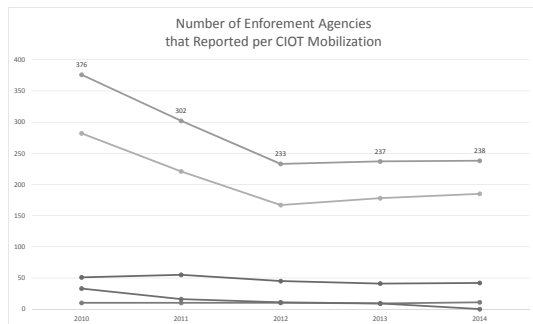

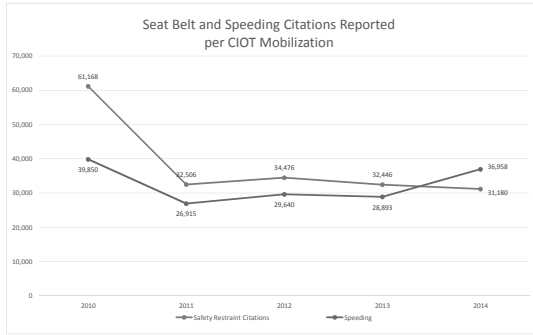

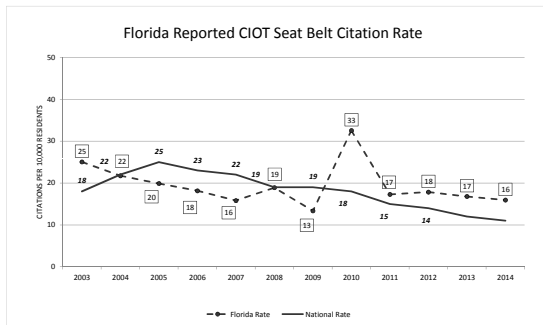

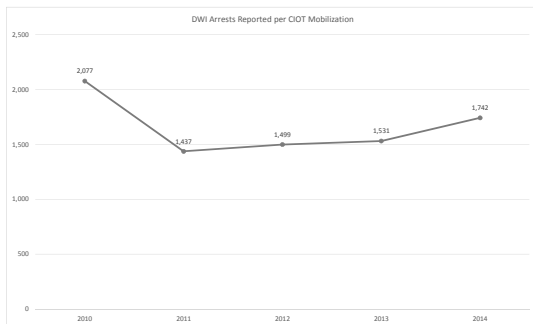

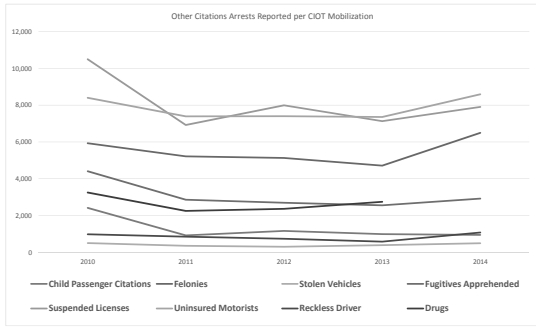

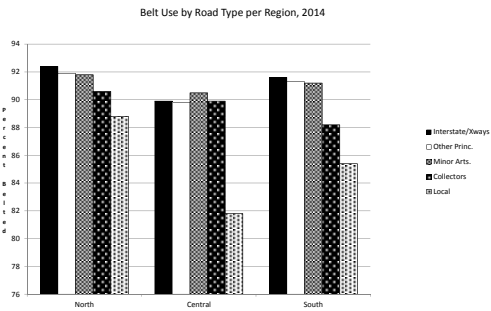
DUI Arrests per CIOT Mobilization
