**California law** requires that children ride in the back seat, properly secured in a safety seat or booster, until they are at least age 8. Children 8-15 must ride properly buckled up in a safety seat, booster, or safety belt. Most children need a booster until age 10-12 for proper belt fit. It is illegal to sell a safety seat or booster that was in use during a crash, but auto insurance companies are required to cover the cost of replacement.

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
