Research & Development: Year 1

- "Older drivers" is actually a misnomer for such programs

 - Visual
 - Physical
 - Cognitive
 - Medication

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General Curriculum Objectives

- Awareness of issues / conditions
- Awareness of their potential impact on driving
- Awareness of resources and potential partners
- Licensing / renewal policies already in place
- Audience-specific roles and responsibilities



Specific Roles

- Law Enforcement
 - Enforce traffic laws
 - Create a paper trail
 - Identify potential issues
- Healthcare
 - Identify conditions or medications
 - that may affect driving
 Accurately make use of medical and vision forms for license renewal
- Senior Services
 - Identify and counsel clients who may exhibit concerning driver behavior
 - Facilitate resources, programming, and partnerships

Curriculum Development: Pilots

- Pilot 1: June 2015
 - developer
- Pilot 2: August 2015
 - trainer with only the training material
- Pilot 3: September 2015
 - trainers with only the revised material
- Trainers: January 2016
 - more comprehensive





Identifying and Training the Trainers Standardized curricula mean more consistency and accuracy Higher level awareness of issues and conditions Familiarity with program, resources, and expectations

Healthcare Provider Participation Many providers are aware of current forms but desire to have additional resources Identifying a group and a champion Adapting schedules and course times Helping Patients Stay Safe Assessing & Counseling Older Drivers

Senior Service Provider Participation SS providers have a closer relationship with senior driver Working with an organization Complementary not competitive

Working with License Authority Programming awareness Partnering for effectiveness Streamlining processes Promoting awareness and material
