Impaired Driving Task Force Report, Overview

- Senate Bill 94 (2017), added California Vehicle Code 2429.7.
- Task Force met between October 2017 through July 2020.
- Reviewed existing practices and information from other states.
- Recommendations were focused on high-level policy issues.

## Impaired Driving Task Force Report, Recommendations

- Data collection, research, toxicology, education, and law enforcement.
- Uniform, accurate, and timely data collection, reporting, and analysis.
- Standardized toxicology practices.
- Broad based public education campaigns aimed at changing social norms and preventing impaired driving, including drug impaired driving.
- Discusses the importance of law enforcement training, equipment to detect, investigate and document impaired driving.

Impaired Driving Task Force Report, Data Recommendations

- The state should track all DUI and DUID arrest outcomes, including case filing charges, diversion outcomes, plea agreements, trial outcomes, and the final case dispositions.
- The state should track all DUI and DUID toxicology outcomes from all laboratories, including the number of samples submitted, the number of samples tested, and all sample results.
- The state should ensure all DUI and DUID involved crashes are reported in a uniform manner to the CHP.
- The state should analyze all collected DUI and DUID data. The data used in the analysis should be published in an annual statewide report and guide the future direction of DUI policy decisions. This report may be used for a variety of purposes including, but not limited to, education; training; and developing better methods to screen for and prevent DUI and DUID.

- California Code of Regulations, Title 13, Division 2, Chapter 13.
- Requests for Application, 2021 Projects.
- Toxicology, \$10 million in available funds.
- Law Enforcement, \$16 million in available funds.
