









In 2012 -

- 79% of Iowa roads are secondary

Total = \$100,000














The High 5 Rural Traffic Safety Project recognizes that:

- ☐ The chances of surviving a traffic crash are 45% higher when properly restrained in a seat belt.
- In 2013 lowa crashes, 229 people were spared death or serious injury due to seat belt use.
- Air bags are designed to work with seat belts. Without a seat belt, the force of a rapidly deploying air bag can severely injure or kill.
- While lowa's statewide seat belt usage is at 92%, over 100,000 drivers plus 20,000 passengers are still unbelted on lowa roadways every day.

As seat belt use has increased in lowa, traffic fatalities have declined.

Q: What is the High Five Rural Traffic Safety Project?

- A: A data-driven, multi-agency effort to increase seat belt use and reduce serious injury and fatal crashes on rural lowa roads through the use of education, engineering and enforcement.
- Q: What areas in Iowa will the program focus on?
- A: In five rural counties that data shows have low seat belt usage rates and high crash rates.
- Q: Don't most crashes occur on major roadways?
- A: In 2012, 72% of fatal crashes were on secondary rural roads and 79% of lowa roads are secondary.
- Q: What are the main causes of rural traffic crashes?
- A: Most rural road crashes involve only one vehicle. Contributing factors include loss of control, lane departure, excessive speed, failure to yield, and impaired driving.
- Q: What will be done to reduce crashes & save lives?
- A: Through enforcement, media and community outreach efforts, participating agencies will work to educate drivers on the benefits of complying with traffic laws, especially lowa's seat belt law.
- Q: Why is increasing seat belt usage so important?
- A: Proper and regular seat belt use is the single most effective way to reduce fatalities and injuries. Seventy-seven percent of vehicle occupants ejected during a crash are killed.
- Q: Can't more be done to make rural roads safer?
- A: Yes. The High Five project includes local and state engineers working together to identify road hazards and make upgrades wherever possible.

Nearly every day someone loses their life in a crash on an lowa road. Most crashes occur on rural roads and they usually involve only one vehicle. What is happening to cause such needless loss of life? We are driving too fast, not paying attention, not wearing our seat belts and we are paying a very high price for these actions.

The single most effective thing any of us can do to be safe in our cars is to wear a safety belt. Nearly all people ejected from a vehicle in any crash are killed. Yet every day, hundreds of lowans are driving or riding with no protection at all. You might think it's the "other guy" out there who is not paying attention but that you are in control. How will you protect yourself from that other guy?

Make life a priority. Choose to be safe. Tell those you love that you want them to be safe too. It takes you, me and everyone to make a change. Together we can make lowa a better and safer place to live work and enjoy.



Since April 1, 2014, the Marion County Sheriff's Office, the County Engineer and the Iowa State Patrol have been working to make our roads safer as part of the High 5 Rural Traffic Safety Project. The project is funded by the Iowa Governor's Traffic Safety Bureau and uses traffic data to target areas of the state with a high crash rate and low seat belt usage. The goal is to increase seat belt use and decrease crashes by improving roadways and changing driver behavior. Drivers need to take driving seriously. Buckle up, pay attention to the road, and slow down. Be part of the solution by being a safe driver.











Seat Belt Convictions





Increase in Observational Seat Belt Usage




Decrease in Number of Overall Crashes


- Data analysis

- Keep the program focused


VISION FOR THE FUTURE
